Maggie B. Gale: Biography & CV [2020]

Professor Maggie B. Gale is Chair in Drama, and Director of Research in the School of Arts Languages and Cultures at the University of Manchester, UK. She is a co-editor of the journal Contemporary Theatre Review, and of the book series, Theatre - Theory – Performance, and Women, Theatre and Performance (both Manchester University Press). Recent publications include, A Social History of British Performance Cultures 1900-1939: Citizenship, Surveillance and the Body (Routledge, 2020); and with Kate Dorney eds., Stage Women 1900-1950: Female Theatre Workers and Professional Practice (Manchester University Press, 2019) and Vivien Leigh: Actress and Icon (Manchester University Press, 2018). Maggie has been on the editorial team of the Open Page a journal of women in international theatre (Odinteatret/Magdalena Project) since its inception and has been involved with the women of the Magdalena Project since the late 1980s. She has published extensively on the work of actresses, women performers and on theatre historiography.
